The carnival arrives and leaves one to two days before and after scheduled dates for set up and tear down.

AGREEMENT FOR SPECIAL SERVICES

This is an Agreement between the City Manager, CITY OF CORCORAN hereinafter referred to as the "City", and the firm of CAVES & ASSOCIATES, hereinafter referred to as "Consultant", entered into as of the date of execution.

RECITALS

The City or its designated representative is required to meet and confer with bargaining agents pursuant to the Meyers-Milias-Brown (MMB) Act.

Consultant has experience and expertise in meeting with bargaining units.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties to this Agreement mutually agree as follows:

- The City hereby designates Consultant as its representative to the meet and confer process with its Police and General Employee's bargaining units and to make use of Consultant's expertise when dealing with all employee groups, organizations and/or units pursuant to the Meyers-Milias-Brown Act.
- 2. Consultant agrees to render all necessary and reasonable services to the City regarding employer/employee relations in accordance with directions as stipulated by the City during the period beginning July 1, 2020, and ending June 30, 2022. Said duties shall include, but not be limited to:
 - A. Act as the City's Representative to the City's Police, Non-Management, Clerical and Related, and General Employee bargaining units at the direction of the City Manager.
 - B. Attend all meetings as needed between the City and its Police, Non-Management, Clerical and Related, and General Employee bargaining units at the direction of the City Manager.
 - C. Reasonable attendance at closed and regular City Council meetings that concern matters of the meet and confer process, as directed by the City Manager.
 - D. Reasonable attendance at specified planning sessions of the Management Team, as directed by the City Manager.
 - E. Provide expert advice to the City regarding all matters concerning the meet and confer process.
 - F. Act as the City's advisor in all mediation procedures, at the direction of the City Manager.
 - G. Assist the City in planning and providing in-service training for Management Team members on subjects of employer-employee relations, at the direction of the City Manager.

Agreement for Special Services - CAVES & ASSOCIATES

- H. Advise & represent the City in the processing of grievances, as requested by the City Manager.
- 3. City shall compensate consultant as follows:
 - A. The City agrees to pay the Consultant for Services rendered under this Agreement the sum of Twelve Thousand Six Hundred Forty Dollars payable in monthly payments of Five Hundred Twenty-Five Dollars (\$525.00) for a minimum of Seventy Two (72) Hours during the contract period. Payments are due and payable on or before the twentieth day of each month. Payment shall be made monthly on the basis of invoices submitted to the City. Payments not made in a timely fashion may be subject to a finance charge, which shall be no greater than rates charged by regional banking institutions.
 - B. Services, if any, rendered by the Consultant in excess of the Seventy Two (72) Hour Minimum provided for in this Agreement, shall be invoiced to the City and paid to the Consultant on a monthly basis at the rate of \$175.00 per hour.
 - C. Non-clerical expenses incurred by the Consultant in the performance of activities requested by the City shall be reimbursed by the City upon presentation of appropriate invoices.
- 4. In addition to Consultant services enumerated above, the Consultant shall during the term of this Agreement, render at City request, supplementary Consultant services under terms and conditions that are mutually acceptable to the parties. Upon mutual consent of both parties, representation to other bargaining units may be added to the Agreement at the annual and/or hourly retainer rate that is mutually acceptable to both parties.
- 5. It is expressly understood and agreed to by both parties that the Consultant, while engaged in carrying out and complying with any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, is an independent contractor and is not an employee of the City.

Recommendation:

Approve agreement with K.W.P.H Enterprises (dba American Ambulance) for lease of approximately 5,000sf of administrative office space at 1031 Chittenden Avenue (APN 030-201-007) and authorize City Manager to sign said agreement.

Discussion:

American Ambulance has expressed interest in leasing approximately 5,000sf of administrative office space of what was previously the Corcoran Police Department.

The lease stipulates a term from March 15, 2020 until December 31, 2020 at \$3,000 per month. American Ambulance has the option to extend the lease for two additional five-year terms.

Budget Impact:

The City's ability to rent the administrative office space to American Ambulance will result in unanticipated revenues to the general fund for the current fiscal year. With a five year extension of the lease agreement, the City can expect \$37,000 to \$40,000 per year in ongoing revenues.

LEASE AGREEMENT

FOR ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICES AT

1031 CHITTENDEN AVENUE

CORCORAN, CALIFORNIA

and

AMERICAN AMBULANCE

___March 10___, 2020

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT ("Lease"), made and entered into effective __March 10_, 2020 by and between the CITY OF CORCORAN, CALIFORNIA, a municipal corporation, ("Landlord" or "City") and K.W.P.H. Enterprises, a California Corporation, dba "American Ambulance", ("Tenant").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, City owns administrative offices located at 1031 Chittenden Avenue, Corcoran, California, APN 030-201-007, as illustrated in crosshatching on the attached Exhibit "A" "Leased Premises"; and

WHEREAS, the City deems it advantageous to itself to lease approximately 5,000 square feet of the administrative offices to Tenant for an initial period with Tenant's exclusive right and, at Tenant's sole discretion, to extend the term of the Lease for an additional five years.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE I

DESCRIPTION OF LEASED PREMISES

The City, in consideration of the compensation and the covenants and agreements set forth herein to be kept and performed by Tenant, does hereby lease to Tenant, upon the conditions hereinafter set forth all of which Tenant accepts, together with attendant privileges, rights, uses, and interests:

1. <u>Administrative Offices</u>: Approximately 5,000 square feet of administrative office space at the property, located at 1031 Chittenden Avenue (excluding jail area), as illustrated in crosshatching on the attached Exhibit "A."

The administrative offices will be collectively referred to as the "Leased Premises."

ARTICLE II

GENERAL PROVISIONS CONCERNING THE MANNER OF USE

The Leased Premises shall be used by Tenant for the purpose of operating ambulance services. Tenant shall not use or permit the Leased Premises, or any part thereof, to be used for any purpose other than stated.

ARTICLE III

TERM

The term of this Lease shall commence on _ March 15,____, 2020 and shall continue through __December 31____, 2020. Tenant shall, at its sole discretion, have an option to extend the term for two additional five-year terms by notifying the City at least 60 days prior to the expiration of the term of its intent to exercise the additional five-year term.

Should Tenant retain possession after the expiration or earlier termination of this lease, Tenant shall become a holdover tenant on a month-to-month basis on the same terms and conditions as then in effect and either City or Tenant may terminate the holdover tenancy by giving the other at least 30 days' prior written notice in the manner otherwise provided in this Lease.

ARTICLE IV

TERMINATION OF LEASE

If either party defaults in the performance of any condition or covenant in this Lease, the other party, at its option, may terminate this Lease, but only if the defaulting party fails to rectify said default within 30 days after written notice thereof is served upon defaulting party by the other party. In the event, however, that any default complained of hereunder is of such nature that the same cannot be rectified in such 30-day period, then such default shall be deemed to be rectified if the defaulting party shall have commenced the compliance of the provisions hereof breached by it and in the performance of which it is claimed to be in default within such 30-day period and shall with all diligence prosecute work or perform the particular provisions until the same shall have been fully rectified or performed.

ARTICLE V

RENT AND EXPENSES

Basic rent shall be paid on or before the first day of each and every successive calendar month during the term hereof pursuant to the following schedule which shall be deemed to have begun as of the date of the commencement date set forth in Article III above:

• March 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020 - \$3,000 per month

Option for first five-year extension:

- January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 \$3,150 per month
- January 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022 \$3,200 per month
- January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023 \$3,250 per month
- January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024 \$3,300 per month
- January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025 \$3,350 per month

Option for second five-year extension:

- January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 \$3,500 per month
- January 1, 2027 through December 31, 2027 \$3,550 per month
- January 1, 2028 through December 31, 2028 \$3,600 per month
- January 1, 2029 through December 31, 2029 \$3,650 per month
- January 1, 2030 through December 31, 2030 \$3,700 per month

As part of the monthly rent, Landlord shall pay for water, sewer, refuse, gas, and electricity. All other utilities shall be paid by the Tenant. At the end of the first term (March 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020) the Landlord and Tenant shall meet and confer in regards to the ongoing payment of the electricity. An amendment to this agreement shall be executed following the meet and confer to outline payment for electricity on an ongoing basis.

In the event that any utility or service provided to the Leased Premises is not separately metered, Landlord shall pay the amount due and separately invoice Tenant for Tenant's pro rata share of the charges.

ARTICLE VI

REPAIRS

During the Lease term, Tenant shall make, at Tenant's expense, all necessary repairs of floors, walls, ceilings, and other parts of the Leased Premises damaged through normal occupancy, except for major mechanical systems or the roof. The City reserves

the right to enter the premises for the purpose of contract compliance, making sure that the Leased Premises is kept in a clean, safe and orderly condition.

ARTICLE VII

ALTERATIONS/IMPROVEMENTS

Tenant, at Tenant's expense, shall have the right following Landlord's written consent to remodel, redecorate, and make additions, improvements, and replacements of and to all or any part of the Office Building occupied by the Tenant from time to time as Tenant may deem desirable, provided the same are made in a workmanlike manner and utilizing good quality materials.

Tenant, at Tenant's expense, shall obtain all necessary permits to complete any alterations or improvements to the Leased Premises.

Tenant shall have the right to place and install personal property, trade fixtures, equipment, and other temporary installations in and upon the Leased Premises and fasten the same to the premises. All personal property, equipment, machinery, trade fixtures, and temporary installations, whether acquired by Tenant at the commencement of the Lease term or placed or installed on the Leased Premises by Tenant thereafter, shall remain Tenant's property free and clear of any claim by Landlord. Tenant shall have the right to remove the same at any time during the term of this Lease provided that all damage to the Leased Premises caused by such removal shall be repaired by Tenant at Tenant's expense.

ARTICLE VIII

HAZARDOUS MATERIAL

Tenant shall be solely responsible for and shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all claims, demands, causes of action, damages, costs and liabilities, including attorney's fees and costs, arising out of, in connection with, or in any way related to, the storage, generation, handling, brokering, release, use or disposal of hazardous materials by Tenant, its agents, members, customers, guests, invitees, licensees, employees, contractors, subcontractors or subtenants.

Tenant shall not store, use, generate, handle, broker, release, or dispose of any hazardous materials on or about the Leased Premises; provided, however, that Tenant shall have the right to store and use reasonable amounts of chemicals and/or solvents used for ordinary office equipment.

If any removal, clean-up, remediation or restoration work is needed, whether or not in accordance with appropriate law, because of the presence of hazardous materials on

or about the Leased Premises or surrounding properties caused or permitted by Tenant then Tenant shall, at its sole cost, immediately notify the City in writing and promptly take or cause to be taken any and all action necessary to perform such removal, clean-up, remediation or restoration work. Tenant shall be solely responsible for, and shall defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against, all claims, demands, damages, costs and liabilities, including attorney's fees and costs, arising out of or in connection with any such removal, remediation, clean-up or restoration work (including but not limited to all materials).

The parties hereto expressly agree that the provisions contained herein shall survive the termination or expiration of Tenant's leasehold estate.

ARTICLE IX

SURRENDER

At the expiration of the life of this Lease or any prior termination thereof, Tenant agrees to quietly and peacefully surrender possession of said Leased Premises to the City in a neat and clean condition. The city will not be responsible for any equipment or supplies left on the Leased Premises.

ARTICLE X

Accessibility Requirements

The Leased Premises have not been issued a disability access inspection certificate under California Civil Code section 1938. Therefore, City states as follows in accordance with California Civil Code section 1938, subdivision (e):

A Certified Access Specialist (CASp) can inspect the subject premises and determine whether the subject premises comply with all of the applicable construction-related accessibility standards under state law. Although state law does not require a CASp inspection of the subject premises, the commercial property owner or lessor may not prohibit the lessee or tenant from obtaining a CASp inspection of the subject premises for the occupancy or potential occupancy of the lessee or tenant, if requested by the lessee or tenant. The parties shall mutually agree on the arrangements for the time and manner of the CASp inspection, the payment of the fee for the CASp inspection, and the cost of making any repairs necessary to correct violations of construction-related accessibility standards within the premises.

ARTICLE XI

INSURANCE

If the Leased Premises or any other part of the Leased Premises is damaged by fire or other casualty resulting from the negligence of Tenant or any of Tenant's agents, employees or invitees, rent shall not be diminished or abated while such damages are under repair, and Tenant shall be responsible for the costs of repair not covered by insurance.

The City shall maintain fire and extended coverage insurance on the Office Building in such amounts as City shall deem appropriate. Tenant shall be responsible, at its expense, for fire and extended coverage insurance on all of its personal property, including removable trade fixtures, located in the Leased Premises.

Tenant, at its own expense, shall maintain a policy or policies of comprehensive general liability insurance with respect to Tenant's activities at the Leased Premises with the premiums thereon fully paid on or before due date, such insurance to afford minimum protection of not less than \$1,000,000 combined single limit coverage of bodily injury, property damage or combination thereof. The City shall be listed as an additional insured on Tenant's policy or policies of comprehensive general liability insurance, and Tenant shall provide the City with current Certificates of Insurance evidencing Tenant's compliance with this paragraph. Tenant shall obtain the agreement of Tenant's insurers to notify the City that a policy is due to expire at least ten days prior to such expiration. The City shall not be required to maintain insurance against thefts within the Leased Premises.

ARTICLE XII

SIGNS

Following City's written consent, Tenant shall have the right to place on the Leased Premises, at locations selected by Tenant, any signs which are permitted by applicable zoning ordinances and private restrictions. The City may refuse to consent to any proposed signage that is in City's opinion too large, deceptive, unattractive, or otherwise inconsistent with or inappropriate to the Leased Premises or use of any other tenant. The City shall assist and cooperate with Tenant in obtaining any necessary permission from governmental authorities or adjoining owners and occupants for Tenant to place or construct the foregoing signs. Tenant shall repair all damage to the Leased Premises resulting from the removal of signs installed by Tenant.

ARTICLE XIII

Premises. The City shall comply with all laws, orders, ordinances and other public requirements now or hereafter affecting the Leased Premises.

- F. <u>Final Agreement</u>: This Agreement terminates and supersedes all prior understandings or agreements on the subject matter hereof. This Agreement may be modified only by a further writing that is duly executed by both parties.
- G. <u>Governing Law</u>: This Agreement shall be governed, construed and interpreted by, through and under the laws of the State of California.
- H. <u>Landlord's Right of Entry</u>: Tenant shall permit Landlord, and its Agents, to enter the Leases Premises at all reasonable times following reasonable notice (except in an emergency) to inspect, maintain and make repairs to IT and telecommunication equipment and switches located on the Leased Premises. Landlord will make reasonable efforts not to inconvenience Tenant in exercising such rights, but Landlord shall not be liable for any interference with Tenant's occupancy resulting from Landlord's entry.

Recommendation:

At second Public Hearing on April 14, 2020, staff recommends that the City Council review comments from the public and staff at both Public Hearing (March 10, 2020 and April 14, 2020) and adopt Resolution after the April public hearing with one of the following findings:

- 1: There are no unmet transit needs.
- 2. There are no unmet transit needs that are reasonable to meet.
- 3. There are unmet transit needs, including needs that are reasonable to meet.

Discussion:

At the March 10, 2020, and April 14, 2020 Council Meeting, the City Council will be conducting a public hearing mandated by State Law, to allow the opportunity for public input on whether or not there are transit needs in the community that are reasonable to meet and are not being met by our existing service. At the conclusion of the hearing on April 14, 2020, the Council will be requested to adopt a Resolution with one of the above-listed findings.

The California Transportation Development Act of 1971 established the Local Transportation Fund (LTF), which is administered by the Kings County Association of Governments (KCAG) Transportation Policy Committee (TPC). When claims are received for LTF money for purposes not directly related to public transportation services, specialized transportation services, or facilities provided for the exclusive use of pedestrians and bicycles, the following items must be considered first:

- a) Low mobility person's transit needs
- b) Adequate accessible public transit service is available in the jurisdictions of each claimant

At this time, staff is unaware of any unmet transit needs in the community. The City always has forms available for comment for the users of this service and for the community to notify us of any needs not being met. Unless new issues are raised during the hearing, staff would recommend the adoption of a Resolution on April 14, 2020 indicating there are no unmet transit needs.

Budget Impact:

There is the potential for additional funds to be available for streets and roads maintenance activities in the City of Corcoran.
