SUBJECT: Discussion for mandatory installation of a Rapid Entry System on all new commercial and industrial buildings and re-models for rapid and easy access for emergency services.

Recommendation:

Recommend to approve Resolution and send to the City Council for final approval for the mandatory installation of a rapid entry system on all new commercial and industrial building and re-models.

Discussion:

At the regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting of March 14, 2016 the Planning Commission heard information regarding A Rapid Entry System and asked Staff to bring back the information under a Public Hearing for citizen input. A rapid entry system (most popular is a system known as a Know-Box) is a small, wall mounted safe that holds building keys for Fire Departments, Emergency Medical Services, and sometimes Police Departments to retrieve in emergency situations. Local Fire Departments typically hold a master key to all boxes in their response area, so they can quickly enter a building without having to force entry or find individual keys held in deposit at the station. The master key for the system is stored in a secure key retention device that can be installed at the station or even on the fire truck. The retention device provide accountability regarding access through an audit trail when the key is accessed. These systems can simplify key control for fire department and cut fire losses and damage done by fire fighters who must break doors and windows to gain access. It will also reduce the potential of firefighter injury during forced entry. In case of fire and medical emergency every second counts.

Budget Impact:

This will have a small positive impact on the budget as it relates to permitting.

Revision to the Corcoran Zoning Code Regarding Animal Keeping

Recommendation: To approve the revision to Corcoran Zoning Code and recommend staff to prepare an Ordinance and Public Hearing for City Council review.

Discussion: At the regularly scheduled Planning Commission meeting of March 14, 2016 a second discussion was held regarding the zoning code as it pertains to the use of animals as a form of security for commercial and industrial properties. The Planning Commission asked staff to bring back language and a revision to the Zoning Code that will help alleviate potential problems. Staff proposes addition to section 11-15-2 Animal Keeping, and revision of the definition of Animal Keeping. There is no significant environmental impact regarding this action therefore, CEQA does not apply.

11-15-2 B-3: The use of animals as a form of security in commercial or industrial zones is allowed by conditional use permit.

Under definition of Animal Keeping and raising: Recommended change.
