




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CORCORAN IRRIGATION DISTRICT IN KINGS COUNTY NEAR THE CITY OF CORCORAN

SUBJECT: SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Application

Summary:

California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) is making available a non-competitive grant of \$27,877 to the City of Corcoran for implementation of SB 1383 for mandated organic waste recycling and food recovery.

Recommendation:

Consider approving Resolution No. 3117 to authorize the City Manager to apply for CalRecycle grants for the next 5 years.

Budget impact:

None with this action. If awarded, the city will receive \$27,877 to support SB 1383 implementation efforts that include materials purchase, educational marketing, and staff time.

Background:

On January 4, 2022, the City of Corcoran was notified by CalRecycle that SB 1383 Local Assistance Grant Program funds are available to the City. This grant is non-competitive, and Corcoran is identified as eligible for \$27,877. Grant funds must be used for SB 1383 implementation efforts related to organic waste recycling and edible food recovery. As a new mandated activity, these funds will assist that City in some SB 1383 implementation efforts.

The deadline for submittal was February 1, 2022, by noon. The City Manager in coordination with our Public Works Department and solid waste hauler, prepared and submitted the grant application on time. An approved Council Resolution authorizing the City Manager to apply for the grant is now needed to finalize the application and be submitted by March 1, 2022.
