Public Hearing to obtain comments and waive the second reading on proposed Ordinance 643 amending Title 8 of the Corcoran Municipal Code, establishing and clarifying water service regulations pertaining to water service billing, connections, reconnections, disconnections of service for delinquent accounts.

**Recommendation:** Waive Second Reading and approve Ordinance 643

<u>Discussion</u>: Senate Bill 988 (SB988) discontinuation of residential water service for non-payment was signed into law in September 2018. SB988 requires all public water systems to have written policy on water service disconnection for nonpayment. SB988 provides that a customer must be at least 60 days delinquent in payment of a utility bill before the City may terminate his or her service. The policy shall be applicable to all residential water customers which will result in expanded notification procedures prior to service disconnection for nonpayment. The bill prohibits discontinuation of water service if all the following conditions are met.

- 1. A primary care provider certifies that discontinuation will be life-threatening or poses a serious threat to the heath and safety of a resident on the premises where service is provided; and
- 2. A customer demonstrates he or she is financially unable to pay; and
- 3. A customer is willing to enter an amortization agreement, alternate payment schedule, or plan for a deferred or reduced payment.

If adopted, the attached ordinance will take effect 30 days after the date of adoption.

#### CHAPTER 891

An act to add Chapter 6 (commencing with Section 116900) to Part 12 of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to water.

[Approved by Governor September 28, 2018. Filed with Secretary of State September 28, 2018.]

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 998, Dodd. Discontinuation of residential water service: urban and community water systems.

Existing law, the California Safe Drinking Water Act, requires the State Water Resources Control Board to administer provisions relating to the regulation of drinking water to protect public health. Existing law declares it to be the established policy of the state that every human being has the right to safe, clean, affordable, and accessible water adequate for human consumption cooking and sanitary purposes.

consumption, cooking, and sanitary purposes.

Under existing law, the Public Utilities Commission has regulatory authority over public utilities, including water corporations. Existing law requires certain notice to be given before a water corporation, public utility district, municipal utility district, or a municipally owned or operated public utility furnishing water may terminate residential service for nonpayment

of a delinquent account, as prescribed.

This bill would require an urban and community water system, defined as a public water system that supplies water to more than 200 service connections, to have a written policy on discontinuation of water service to certain types of residences for nonpayment available in prescribed languages. The bill would require the policy to include certain components, be available on the system's Internet Web site, and be provided to customers in writing. upon request. The bill would provide for enforcement of these provisions, including making a violation of these provisions punishable by a civil penalty issued by the board in an amount not to exceed \$1,000 for each day in which the violation occurs, and would require the enforcement moneys collected by the board to be deposited in the Safe Drinking Water Account. The bill would prohibit an urban and community water system from discontinuing residential service for nonpayment until a payment by a customer has been delinquent for at least 60 days. The bill would require an urban and community water system to contact the customer named on the account and provide the customer with the urban and community water system's policy on discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment no less than 7 business days before discontinuation of residential service, as prescribed.

This bill would prohibit residential service from being discontinued under specified circumstances. The bill would require an urban and community

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water system that discontinues residential service to provide the customer with information on how to restore service. The bill would require an urban and community water system to waive interest charges on delinquent bills for, and would limit the amount of a reconnection of service fee imposed on, a residential customer who demonstrates, as prescribed, to the urban and community water system household income below 200% of the federal poverty line. The bill would require an urban and community water system that furnishes individually metered residential service to residential occupants of a detached single-family dwelling, a multiunit structure, mobilehome park, or permanent residential structure in a labor camp, and that the owner, manager, or operator of the dwelling, structure, or park is the customer of record, to make every good faith effort to inform the residential occupants by written notice that service will be terminated and that the residential occupants have the right to become customers, as specified. The bill would require an urban and community water system to report the number of annual discontinuations of residential service for inability to pay on its Internet Web site and to the board, and the bill would require the board to post on its Internet Web site the information reported. The bill would require an urban water supplier, as defined, or an urban and community water system regulated by the commission, to comply with the bill's provisions on and after February 1, 2020, and any other urban and community water system to comply with the bill's provisions on and after April 1, 2020. The bill would provide that the provisions of the bill are in addition to the provisions in existing law duplicative of the bill and that where the provisions are inconsistent, the provisions described in the bill apply.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares as follows:

(a) All Californians have the right to safe, accessible, and affordable water as declared by Section 106.3 of the Water Code.

(b) It is the intent of the Legislature to minimize the number of Californians who lose access to water service due to inability to pay.

- (c) Water service discontinuations threaten human health and well-being, and have disproportionate impact on infants, children, the elderly, low-income families, communities of color, people for whom English is a second language, physically disabled persons, and persons with life-threatening medical conditions.
- (d) When there is a delinquent bill, all Californians, regardless of whether they pay a water bill directly, should be treated fairly, and fair treatment includes the ability to contest a bill, seek alternative payment schedules, and demonstrate medical need and severe economic hardship.
- (e) The loss of water service causes tremendous hardship and undue stress, including increased health risks to vulnerable populations.
- (f) It is the intent of the Legislature that this act provide additional procedural protections and expand upon the procedural safeguards contained

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in the Public Utilities Code and Government Code as of January 1, 2018, relating to utility service disconnections.

SEC. 2. Chapter 6 (commencing with Section 116900) is added to Part 12 of Division 104 of the Health and Safety Code, to read:

#### CHAPTER 6. DISCONTINUATION OF RESIDENTIAL WATER SERVICE

116900. This chapter shall be known, and may be cited, as the Water Shutoff Protection Act.

116902. For the purposes of this chapter, the following definitions apply:

(a) "Board" means the State Water Resources Control Board.

- (b) "Public water system" has the same meaning as defined in Section 116275.
- (c) "Residential service" means water service to a residential connection that includes single-family residences, multifamily residences, mobilehomes, including, but not limited to, mobilehomes in mobilehome parks, or farmworker housing.
- (d) "Urban and community water system" means a public water system that supplies water to more than 200 service connections.
- (e) "Urban water supplier" has the same meaning as defined in Section 10617 of the Water Code.

116904. (a) An urban water supplier not regulated by the Public Utilities Commission shall comply with this chapter on and after February 1, 2020.

- (b) An urban and community water system regulated by the Public Utilities Commission shall comply with this chapter on and after February 1, 2020. The urban and community water system regulated by the Public Utilities Commission shall file advice letters with the commission to conform with this chapter.
- (c) An urban and community water system not described in subdivision (a) or (b) shall comply with this chapter on and after April 1, 2020.
- 116906. (a) An urban and community water system shall have a written policy on discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment available in English, the languages listed in Section 1632 of the Civil Code, and any other language spoken by at least 10 percent of the people residing in its service area. The policy shall include all of the following:
  - (1) A plan for deferred or reduced payments.
  - (2) Alternative payment schedules.
  - (3) A formal mechanism for a customer to contest or appeal a bill.
- (4) A telephone number for a customer to contact to discuss options for averting discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment.
- (b) The policy shall be available on the urban and community water system's Internet Web site, if an Internet Web site exists. If an Internet Web site does not exist, the urban and community water system shall provide the policy to customers in writing, upon request.
- (c) (1) The board may enforce the requirements of this section pursuant to Sections 116577, 116650, and 116655. The provisions of Section 116585

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and Article 10 (commencing with Section 116700) of Chapter 4 apply to enforcement undertaken for a violation of this section.

(2) All moneys collected pursuant to this subdivision shall be deposited in the Safe Drinking Water Account established pursuant to Section 116590.

- 116908. (a) (I) (A) An urban and community water system shall not discontinue residential service for nonpayment until a payment by a customer has been delinquent for at least 60 days. No less than seven business days before discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment, an urban and community water system shall contact the customer named on the account by telephone or written notice.
- (B) When the urban and community water system contacts the customer named on the account by telephone pursuant to subparagraph (A), it shall offer to provide in writing to the customer the urban and community water system's policy on discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment. An urban and community water system shall offer to discuss options to avert discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment, including, but not limited to, alternative payment schedules, deferred payments, minimum payments, procedures for requesting amortization of the unpaid balance, and petition for bill review and appeal.
- (C) When the urban and community water system contacts the customer named on the account by written notice pursuant to subparagraph (A), the written notice of payment delinquency and impending discontinuation shall be mailed to the customer of the residence to which the residential service is provided. If the customer's address is not the address of the property to which residential service is provided, the notice also shall be sent to the address of the property to which residential service is provided, addressed to "Occupant." The notice shall include, but is not limited to, all of the following information in a clear and legible format:
  - (i) The customer's name and address.
  - (ii) The amount of the delinquency.
- (iii) The date by which payment or arrangement for payment is required in order to avoid discontinuation of residential service.
- (iv) A description of the process to apply for an extension of time to pay the delinquent charges.
  - (v) A description of the procedure to petition for bill review and appeal.
- (vi) A description of the procedure by which the customer may request a deferred, reduced, or alternative payment schedule, including an amortization of the delinquent residential service charges, consistent with the written policies provided pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 116906.
- (2) If the urban and community water system is unable to make contact with the customer or an adult occupying the residence by telephone, and written notice is returned through the mail as undeliverable, the urban and community water system shall make a good faith effort to visit the residence and leave, or make other arrangements for placement in a conspicuous place of, a notice of imminent discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment and the urban and community water system's policy for discontinuation of residential service for nonpayment.

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(b) If an adult at the residence appeals the water bill to the urban and community water system or any other administrative or legal body to which such an appeal may be lawfully taken, the urban and community water system shall not discontinue residential service while the appeal is pending.

116910. (a) An urban and community water system shall not discontinue residential service for nonpayment if all of the following conditions are met:

- (1) The customer, or a tenant of the customer, submits to the urban and community water system the certification of a primary care provider, as that term is defined in subparagraph (A) of paragraph (1) of subdivision (b) of Section 14088 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, that discontinuation of residential service will be life threatening to, or pose a serious threat to the health and safety of, a resident of the premises where residential service is provided.
- (2) The customer demonstrates that he or she is financially unable to pay for residential service within the urban and community water system's normal billing cycle. The customer shall be deemed financially unable to pay for residential service within the urban and community water system's normal billing cycle if any member of the customer's household is a current recipient of CalWORKs, CalFresh, general assistance, Medi-Cal, Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment Program, or California Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children, or the customer declares that the household's annual income is less than 200 percent of the federal poverty level.
- (3) The customer is willing to enter into an amortization agreement, alternative payment schedule, or a plan for deferred or reduced payment, consistent with the written policies provided pursuant to subdivision (a) of Section 116906, with respect to all delinquent charges.
- (b) (1) If the conditions listed in subdivision (a) are met, the urban and community water system shall offer the customer one or more of the following options:

(A) Amortization of the unpaid balance.

- (B) Participation in an alternative payment schedule.
- (C) A partial or full reduction of the unpaid balance financed without additional charges to other ratepayers.
  - (D) Temporary deferral of payment.
- (2) The urban and community water system may choose which of the payment options described in paragraph (1) the customer undertakes and may set the parameters of that payment option. Ordinarily, the repayment option offered should result in repayment of any remaining outstanding balance within 12 months. An urban and community water system may grant a longer repayment period if it finds the longer period is necessary to avoid undue hardship to the customer based on the circumstances of the individual case.
- (3) Residential service may be discontinued no sooner than 5 business days after the urban and community water system posts a final notice of intent to disconnect service in a prominent and conspicuous location at the property under either of the following circumstances:

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(A) The customer fails to comply with an amortization agreement, an alternative payment schedule, or a deferral or reduction in payment plan for delinquent charges for 60 days or more.

(B) While undertaking an amortization agreement, an alternative payment schedule, or a deferral or reduction in payment plan for delinquent charges, the customer does not pay his or her current residential service charges for 60 days or more.

116912. An urban and community water system that discontinues residential service for nonpayment shall provide the customer with information on how to restore residential service.

116914. (a) For a residential customer who demonstrates to an urban and community water system household income below 200 percent of the federal poverty line, the urban and community water system shall do both of the following:

- (1) Set a reconnection of service fee for reconnection during normal operating hours at fifty dollars (\$50), but not to exceed the actual cost of reconnection if it is less. Reconnection fees shall be subject to an annual adjustment for changes in the Consumer Price Index beginning January 1, 2021. For the reconnection of residential service during nonoperational hours, an urban and community water system shall set a reconnection of service fee at one hundred fifty dollars (\$150), but not to exceed the actual cost of reconnection if it is less. Reconnection fees shall be subject to an annual adjustment for changes in the Consumer Price Index beginning January 1, 2021.
  - (2) Waive interest charges on delinquent bills once every 12 months.
- (b) An urban and community water system shall deem a residential customer to have a household income below 200 percent of the federal poverty line if any member of the household is a current recipient of CalWORKs, CalFresh, general assistance, Medi-Cal, Supplemental Security Income/State Supplementary Payment Program, or California Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children, or the customer declares that the household's annual income is less than 200 percent of the federal poverty level.
- 116916. (a) This section applies if there is a landlord-tenant relationship between the residential occupants and the owner, manager, or operator of the dwelling.
- (b) If an urban and community water system furnishes individually metered residential service to residential occupants of a detached single-family dwelling, a multiunit residential structure, mobilehome park, or permanent residential structure in a labor camp as defined in Section 17008, and the owner, manager, or operator of the dwelling, structure, or park is the customer of record, the urban and community water system shall make every good faith effort to inform the residential occupants, by means of written notice, when the account is in arrears that service will be terminated at least 10 days prior to the termination. The written notice shall further inform the residential occupants that they have the right to become

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customers, to whom the service will then be billed, without being required to pay any amount which may be due on the delinquent account.

- (c) The urban and community water system is not required to make service available to the residential occupants unless each residential occupant agrees to the terms and conditions of service and meets the requirements of law and the urban and community water system's rules and tariffs. However, if one or more of the residential occupants are willing and able to assume responsibility for the subsequent charges to the account to the satisfaction of the urban and community water system, or if there is a physical means legally available to the urban and community water system of selectively terminating service to those residential occupants who have not met the requirements of the urban and community water system's rules and tariffs, the urban and community water system's rules and tariffs, the urban and community water system shall make service available to those residential occupants who have met those requirements.
- (d) If prior service for a period of time is a condition for establishing credit with the urban and community water system, residence and proof of prompt payment of rent or other credit obligation acceptable to the urban and community water system for that period of time is a satisfactory equivalent.
- (e) Any residential occupant who becomes a customer of the urban and community water system pursuant to this section whose periodic payments, such as rental payments, include charges for residential water service, where those charges are not separately stated, may deduct from the periodic payment each payment period all reasonable charges paid to the urban and community water system for those services during the preceding payment period.
- (f) In the case of a detached single-family dwelling, the urban and community water system may do any of the following:
- (1) Give notice of termination at least seven days prior to the proposed termination.
- (2) In order for the amount due on the delinquent account to be waived, require an occupant who becomes a customer to verify that the delinquent account customer of record is or was the landlord, manager, or agent of the dwelling. Verification may include, but is not limited to, a lease or rental agreement, rent receipts, a government document indicating that the occupant is renting the property, or information disclosed pursuant to Section 1962 of the Civil Code.
- 116918. An urban and community water system shall report the number of annual discontinuations of residential service for inability to pay on the urban and community water system's Internet Web site, if an Internet Web site exists, and to the board. The board shall post on its Internet Web site the information reported.
- 116920. (a) The Attorney General, at the request of the board or upon his or her own motion, may bring an action in state court to restrain by temporary or permanent injunction the use of any method, act, or practice declared in this chapter to be unlawful.

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(b) For an urban and community water system regulated by the Public Utilities Commission, the commission may bring an action in state court to restrain by temporary or permanent injunction the use by an urban and community water system regulated by the commission of any method, act,

or practice declared in this chapter to be unlawful.

116922. All written notices required under this chapter shall be provided in English, the languages listed in Section 1632 of the Civil Code, and any other language spoken by 10 percent or more of the customers in the urban

and community water system's service area.

116924. Where provisions of existing law are duplicative of this chapter, compliance with one shall be deemed compliance with the other. Where those provisions are inconsistent, the provisions of this chapter shall apply. Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to limit or restrict the procedural safeguards against the disconnection of residential water service existing

as of December 31, 2018.

116926. This chapter does not apply to the termination of a service connection by an urban and community water system due to an unauthorized action of a customer.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 643

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CORCORAN ENACTING WATER SERVICE REGULATIONS FOR THE CITY OF CORCORAN.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORCORAN DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** PURPOSE. In addition to the purposes specified hereafter, if any, the provisions of this ordinance are intended to enact and clarify water service regulations pertaining to water service billing, metering, service connections, re-connections, temporary service, facilities of the City of Corcoran ("City") and other regulations affecting water customers of the City.

**Section 2.** REPEAL. The City hereby repeals each portion of any now existing City ordinance which is in actual conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, but only to the extent of the particular conflict which actually exists.

**Section 3.** CODE ADOPTION. Chapter \_\_\_\_ of Title 8 is hereby added into the Corcoran Municipal Code, and reads in its entirety as specified in **ATTACHMENT A** to this ordinance, which is fully incorporated into this ordinance as if set forth herein verbatim.

Section 4. CEQA REVIEW. The City Council hereby finds that this ordinance is not subject to review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines sections 15060(c)(2) [the activity will not result in a direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical change in the environment] and 15061(b)(3) [there is no possibility the activity in question may have a significant effect on the environment]. The City Manager or same's designee is hereby directed to ensure that a Notice of Exemption is filed pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15062 [14 C.C.R. § 15062].

**Section 5**. NO LIABILITY. The provisions of this ordinance shall not in any way be construed as imposing any duty of care, liability or responsibility for damage to person or property upon the City of Corcoran, or any official, employee or agent thereof.

Section 6. PENDING ACTIONS. Nothing in this ordinance or in the codes hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding pending or impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance or code repealed by this ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section 7. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance, or its application to any person or circumstance, is for any reason held to be invalid or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases of this ordinance, or its application to any other person or circumstance. The City Council of the City of Corcoran hereby declares that it would have adopted each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase hereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more other sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases hereof be declared invalid or unenforceable.

Section 8. CONSTRUCTION. The City Council intends this ordinance to supplement, not to duplicate or contradict, applicable state and federal law and this ordinance shall be construed in light of that intent. To the extent the provisions of the Corcoran Municipal Code as amended by this ordinance are substantially the same as provisions in the Corcoran Municipal Code existing prior to the effectiveness of this ordinance, then those amended provisions shall be construed as continuations of the earlier provisions and not as new enactments.

Section 9. EFFECTIVE DATE; AND PUBLICATION. The foregoing ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days from the date of the passage hereof. Prior to

SUBJECT:

New Influent Pumping System at Wastewater Treatment Facility.

#### Recommendation:

Consider the purchase of new influent sewage pumps and system piping for the City of Corcoran Wastewater Treatment Facility.

#### Background:

At the wastewater treatment facility, there are four influent pumps that move the raw sewage coming from the collection system into the splitter box, where the sewage is sent to the clarifiers for treatment. The current influent pump system includes four long-shaft vertical turbine centrifugal pumps, which were installed when the plant was first built decades ago. These pumps were chosen in case a pipe burst and flooding occurred within the Influent Building.

The current pumps have long 50-foot shafts that are fitted with bearings and shaft couplings that quickly wear. Replacing these parts requires a 30' ladder that is held against the cover of the shaft, where the operator must remove 16 bolts while keeping balance on the ladder. It is a risky and dangerous task, one that has caused injuries in the past. There is an appropriate and suitable solution to this problem – replace these long-shaft vertical turbine pumps with submersible pumps, which can also withstand a flood, that do not necessitate dangerous maintenance tasks.

#### Discussion:

Staff is seeking Council authorization to purchase four new Homa-brand submersible pumps, installation of new electrical to the lower floor where the pumps will sit, and the deconstruction and reinstallation of the new piping system that will connect the pumps to the existing plant piping.

This is a very important project for the City of Corcoran Wastewater Facility. Currently, two of the four existing pumps are out of service due to the high cost of repairing the worn bearings, and the other two pumps are also beginning to experience bearing and packing failures. This causes raw sewage to leak in the room, which causes an array of other issues, including health risks to the operators. If one or both of these pumps fail completely, setting up a bypass to pump the raw sewage through the plant will be very expensive.

The Homa brand submersible pumps that are quoted are highly efficient pumps with a significant lifetime rating, with an impeller design that ensures the pumps will not get clogged, which is a major concern when pumping raw sewage. The contractors who will be installing the concrete, electrical and piping infrastructure for this project are trusted contractors whom have performed projects for the Wastewater Division in the recent past.

#### **Budget Impact:**

This Project's total cost is \$150,000, excluding taxes, from the 2022-23 Wastewater American Rescue Plan Act budget.

**SUBJECT:** Cannabis Related Dispensary Use In City Zoning

#### **Summary:**

At the July 26, 2022, Council meeting the Council received a request to place on the next Council Agenda a discussion on establishing a Dispensary in the City of Corcoran.

#### **Recommendation:**

Review Staff's presentation, allow public discussion, and consider providing direction to staff.

#### **Budget impact:**

None with this action. Any future action will be evaluated for any potential budgetary costs.

#### **Background:**

The City Council received a public request to discuss the possibility of the City allowing a cannabis dispensary within City limits. Under the Corcoran Zoning Ordinance, cannabis dispensary use is not currently listed as an allowed use in any of the City's Zone Districts. Therefore, if a property owner, agent or the City wishes to consider adding this type of use within City limits a number of considerations will need to be addressed moving forward and follow the City's procedure for a Zoning Code Text Amendment as allowed under Chapter 11-29 of the City's Zoning Ordinance. In this consideration, the specific Zone District would need to be decided where this type of use is most appropriate, and what type of conditions and permit requirements are necessary.

#### **Applicant Initiated Zoning Regulation Change:**

If a Zoning Regulation Change is proposed by a property owner or agent, they would first need to initiate this process by completing a Zoning Code Text Amendment Application with the Community Development Department and pay all applicable fees. The proposed text change would then be processed by staff and require a public hearing with the Corcoran Planning Commission. The Planning Commission would then either make a recommendation of approval

and forward to the City Council, or deny the request. If denied, the applicant has five days to make a written request with the City Clerk for a hearing before the City Council.

If the Planning Commission takes action to recommend approval of the proposal, the amendment is forwarded to the City Council. The City Council would then hold a public hearing and consider the proposal and either take action to approve by ordinance adoption, deny or make modifications not previously considered and refer back to the Planning Commission.

Through this type of applicant initiated process, the applicant would pay the necessary City fees and processing costs associated with the proposal.

#### **Alternative Process:**

As an alternative, the City Council may determine this type of use as of possible benefit to the City and direct staff to initiate a Zoning Code Text Amendment. Under this process, the Community Development Department would develop the proposed changes and conduct public engagement meetings to gather community feedback in developing the final proposed text changes which may include defining the specific zone district, conditions, permit processes, and any other appropriate fees that may be needed in establishing this possible new use permit process.

Through this type of City initiated process, the City would cover the costs of all the processing and defend the action of the Council should any challenges arise. With this approach, the timing of the processing would be subject to Community Development Department staff availability.
