

SUBJECT: SCADA and Security Upgrade for Water Treatment Plant Controls

Recommendation:

Consider upgrades to the SCADA controls system at the City of Corcoran's water treatment plant.

Background:

The City of Corcoran water treatment plant utilizes Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) to control the water treatment plant processes, such as turning on or off groundwater wells, plant and distribution system booster pumps, chemical feed pumps, electrically actuated valves, etc. as needed in real-time for the water treatment plant to operate properly. The hardware that the water plant's SCADA system is based on is Rockwell Automation SLC500 programmable logic controllers (PLC), which function as the "brains" of the water treatment plant. This is outdated hardware from the 1980s that has become obsolete and currently needs to be replaced. The only way to purchase replacement parts is through eBay, where despite being obsolete the parts have become extremely expensive because of their rarity.

Currently, the water treatment plant utilizes many different software programs for the Human Machine Interface (HMI), historization, reporting, and alarming functions. Because of this, compatibility between these software programs has long been a problem for City of Corcoran staff and contractors to work around. For example, an issue with one could cause all the programs to dysfunction. Within the past year, this has been the cause for systematic low pressure in two separate instances. Because water is such a valuable resource for the Corcoran community, it is imperative we have a strong SCADA network that can securely and intelligently control the water treatment plant.

Discussion:

Staff proposes a collaboration involving Performance Industrial Controls (PerFIC), Superior Electric, and Communications Enterprises, Inc (CEI). This project is broken into three essential components, and each will be completed by a different company. PerFIC will complete the water treatment plant controls upgrade. Superior Electric will complete the required electrical work. CEI will complete the wireless system for the communication upgrade that will allow the SCADA system at the water treatment plant to take in the data from the remote groundwater wells and pumping station located elsewhere. The new SCADA system will be outfitted with an up-to-date Rockwell Automation ControLogix controller and associated hardware. The HMI will be Inductive Automation's Ignition system, which will also tie in

the historization, reporting, and alarming functions that are needed for the water treatment plant. This will make for much easier operation and significantly greater functionality.

The SCADA software will be configured with redundant commercial rack servers – a big upgrade from the Dell home computers that currently function as the servers for the water plant's SCADA system. The wireless system will be upgraded from a 900 MHz non-encrypted Modbus network to an 900 MHz encrypted network for much higher security to protect against unwanted users or even international hackers.

This upgrade is a major project for the water treatment plant. It requires multiple steps and parties to properly accomplish. Due to the scale and the expense of the project, this is a two-step process that City staff will look to complete in Fiscal Year 2023-24. After much discussion, the attached proposal contains the parts of the project that should first be completed. Next year, City staff will present a second proposal to finish the SCADA and security upgrade for the water treatment plant controls.

Budget impact:

The cost for this first step of the SCADA and security upgrade for the water treatment plant controls is \$494,197.06 which will be paid from Water Division reserves.

Dear Joseph and Dylan, PerFIC thanks you for this opportunity. The goal of this project is to upgrade the current Controls System for City of Corcoran Arsenic Removal Water Treatment Plant, hereby referred as the Water Plant.

Summary

The Water Plant current Controls System is based on Rockwell Automation SLC500 series of controllers and associated hardware. System also uses GE Proficy IFix32 Version 5.8 software for SCADA and Human Machine Interface (HMI). The Water Plant also has 10 wells on it's surroundings, and remote booster station#2 that use Schneider Electric SCADAPack 32 controllers and associated hardware. Communications from wells and booster station to the Water Plant are carried thru a GR MDS9710 900MHz non-encrypted Modbus Wireless network. The Automation Upgrade Project will replace the Water Plant Control System with a Rockwell Automation ControLogix Controller and associated hardware. Programming of Control Strategies will be rewritten following original Water Plant design documentation. SCADA will be upgraded to Inductive Automation Ignition 8.1 system that includes HMI, Historization, Reporting, Voice and SMS Alarm notification. Being a critical application, the new SCADA software will be installed on redundant commercial rack servers, with a hot backup configuration that can take over immediately if a main server failure is detected. Each of those servers also features a redundant power supply as well. The HMI design goal is to create a situational awareness environment where operators can quickly identify issues and take appropriate action. Upgrade includes Station 2 system with Rockwell Automation CompactLogix controller. The existing 900MHz wireless Modbus network will be replaced with a Cambium N550 900 MHz encrypted network.

SUBJECT: Transit Operator II GPPV Certification Policy

Recommendation:

Consider adopting Resolution No.3969 to approve Transit Operator II General Public Paratransit Vehicle (GPPV) Certification Policy as part of the City's Personnel Manual.

On September 27, 2022, this Council approved the creation of the Transit Operator II job classification and was informed that a follow up policy related to the GPPV Certification would be coming to Council for approval. The GPPV Certification is necessary to perform the position duties related to school children transport. The policy was created to inform Transit Operator II employees of compliance and certification requirements by California Highway Patrol (CHP) and includes an employee acknowledgment and CHP Special Certificate Application for GPPV certification.

The Policy for Transit Operator II GPPV Certification was forwarded to Local 39 for review and comment. Local 39 has reviewed and approved the policy.

CITY OF CORCORAN POLICY FOR TRANSIT OPERATOR II GPPV CERTIFICATION

POLICY

City Transit Operator II required maintenance of California issued General Public Paratransit Vehicle (GPPV) Certification.

CITY TRANSIT OPERATIONAL NEEDS

The City operates City Transit services to support and accommodate community wide transportation needs within a State designated Disadvantaged Community. Transit Operators are required to maintain the necessary licenses, certificates, and/or endorsements that allow them to perform their job duties and remain eligible to operate City Transit vehicles. As City Transit services are also used to support the safe transport of students, and provide some school district related transportation services, the Transit Operator II is a higher-level classification requiring GPPV Certification to support that service. Transit Operators who do not maintain GPPV Certification are ineligible to drive for students, and therefore no longer qualifying to support the added services under Transit Operator II. Should this occur, the unfortunate result is a shift of added responsibility to the other qualified drivers to cover. This type of situation also potentially poses increased driver scheduling challenges that may hinder the City's ability to maintain full support of the City's transit services.

GRACE PERIOD FOR COMPLIANCE

When a Transit Operator II GPPV Certification is up for renewal, the Transit Coordinator or Transit Manager is notified by the California Highway Patrol (CHP) and the employee is then made aware of their Certification status and need for renewal. The employee will remain in the Transit Operator II classification while diligently pursuing their standard one application CHP renewal for their certification. Should the certification lapse, the employee's job duties shall be remediated to Transit Operator I job duties to not cause undue liability or driver compliance issues for the City. This remediation to Transit Operator I job duties is a grace period for the employee to remain employed as a Transit Operator and allow additional opportunity for the employee to complete their initial renewal application for GPPV Certification. Any secondary application resulting from a failed initial application is not covered under this grace period.

FAILURE TO RENEW GPPV CERTIFICATION

The CHP GPPV Application allows three attempts under one initial application to renew GPPV Certification. Should an employee fail to obtain renewal of their GPPV Certification under their initial application, the CHP requires submittal of an entirely new second application to be submitted. Should a Transit Operator II fail to renew their GPPV Certification under the initial application, the employee shall be considered no

longer qualifying as a Transit Operator II and reclassified to Transit Operator I during the next immediate City pay period.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT

Employees hired or promoted to Transit Operator II shall be required to sign a City acknowledging form (attached as Exhibit A) demonstrating their understanding of the GPPV Certification requirement and resulting consequences should they fail to maintain this certification.



- \$12 for DL-45.

REQUIRED TESTS

- An applicant must pass a written test on the laws and regulations governing
 passenger transportation safety and safe driving practices. The test may be
 taken prior to the return of the criminal background review. A written test is
 not required for a VDDP certificate.
- 2. An applicant must pass a drive test using a vehicle comparable to those to be driven by the applicant. The drive test includes a pre-trip inspection of all gauges, instruments, and controls, with critical emphasis on brake systems and their operation. The drive test shall not be taken prior to the return of the criminal background review. Restrictions may be placed on the certificate depending on the type of vehicle used during the drive test. A drive test is not required for a VDDP certificate.
- 3. An applicant for a school or youth bus driver certificate must pass a written first aid test. This test may be waived if the applicant possesses a current first aid certificate issued by the American Red Cross or by an organization approved by the Emergency Medical Services Authority, or possesses a current license as a physician and surgeon, osteopathic physician and surgeon, or registered nurse, or a current certificate as a physician's assistant or emergency medical technician.
- 4. Tests for certificate upgrades may be required.

MANDATORY DISQUALIFYING CRITERIA

DMV shall deny or revoke the certificate if the applicant:

- Has been convicted of a sex offense defined in Section 44010 of the Education Code (EDC).
- Has been convicted, within the preceding two years, of an offense involving the use, possession, or sale of drugs.
- Has been convicted, within the preceding three years, of hit and run, reckless driving, or driving under the influence.
- Has been convicted of a violent or serious crime per Sections 667.5(c) or 1192.5(c) of the Penal Code.
- 5. Fails to pass the written test(s) or drive test.
- Within the preceding three years, has had driving privileges revoked or suspended, or has been placed on probation for any reason involving unsafe operation of a motor vehicle.

DISCRETIONARY DISQUALIFYING CRITERIA

DMV may deny, suspend, or revoke the certificate if the applicant:

- Has committed any act involving moral turpitude, regardless of when the act was committed.
- 2. Has been the cause of three crashes within the last 12 months.
- Has been the cause of a crash resulting in a fatality, serious injury, or \$1,000 damage within the preceding 24 months.
- Has violated any law, rule, or regulation for the safe operation of a vehicle for which the certificate was issued.
- 5. Has violated any restriction of the certificate.
- 6. Has made a false statement on the application.
- 7. Is a negligent or incompetent operator.
- 8. Habitually uses or is addicted to alcohol or drugs.
- 9. Does not meet minimum medical standards.
- 10. Has been convicted of specific crimes within the past seven years.
- 11. Has been convicted of an offense, other than a sex offense, that is punishable as a felony within the past seven years.
- 12. Has been dismissed for a cause related to pupil transportation safety.
- Has been convicted, within the preceding seven years, of any offense related to the use, sale, possession, or transportation of drugs.
- Has been arrested for or charged with any sex offense, as defined in Section 44010 EDC.
- Violates Section 5387(b) of the Public Utilities Code (driving a bus without a current/valid driver license of the proper class, a passenger vehicle endorsement, or the required certificate).
- Has been reported to have left a pupil unattended on a school bus pursuant to Section 39843 EDC.

PHYSICAL QUALIFICATIONS

An applicant is physically qualified to drive a vehicle if the person:

- Has no loss of a foot, a leg, a hand, or an arm, or has been granted a waiver pursuant to Section 391.49 of the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations (FMCSR).
- 2. Has no impairment of a hand or finger which interferes with prehension or power grasping; or, an arm, foot, or leg which interferes with the ability to perform normal tasks associated with operating a motor vehicle; or any other significant limb defect or limitation which interferes with the ability to perform normal tasks associated with operating a motor vehicle; or has been granted a waiver pursuant to Section 391.49 FMCSR.
- Has no myocardial infarction, angina pectoris, coronary insufficiency, thrombosis, or any other cardiovascular disease of a variety known to be accompanied by syncope, dyspnea, collapse, or congestive cardiac failure.
- Has no respiratory dysfunction likely to interfere with the ability to control and drive a motor vehicle safely.
- Has blood pressure in accordance with Section 391.43(f) FMCSR.
- 6. Has no established medical history or clinical diagnosis of rheumatic, arthritic, orthopedic, muscular, neuromuscular, or vascular disease which interferes with the ability to control and operate a motor vehicle safely.
- Has no established medical history or clinical diagnosis of epilepsy or loss of consciousness.
- Has no mental, nervous, organic, or functional disease or psychiatric disorder likely to interfere with the ability to drive a motor vehicle safely.
- Has distant visual acuity of at least 20/40 (Snellen) in each eye with or without corrective lenses and at least 70 degrees in the horizontal meridian in each eye, and the ability to recognize the colors red, green, and amber.
- 10. First perceives a forced whispered voice at not less than 5 feet in the better ear with or without the use of a hearing aid.
- 11. Does not use an amphetamine, narcotic, or any habit-forming drug.
- 12. Has no current clinical diagnosis of alcoholism.

Corcoran Fringe Solid Waste Accounts

Summary:

Kings County recently adopted their SB 1383 Ordinance which will impact City collection of Corcoran Fringe solid waste accounts.

Recommendation:

Review County Ordinance Changes and consider directing the City Manager to notify Corcoran Fringe accounts of the change.

Budget impact:

Estimated cost of the notice mailout is approximately \$100 and can be covered under Council publications.

Background:


The State's adoption of SB 1383 requires new waste hauling changes related to organic waste. The City of Corcoran adopted an SB 1383 ordinance on March 22, 2022, and is currently in compliance with CalRecycle requirements. The County of Kings filed for an extension and was given till late September to adopt and enforceable SB 1383 ordinance. On October 4, 2022, the County Board of Supervisors had their second reading and adopted an SB 1383 ordinance. This ordinance, however, will become effective November 3, 2022, and make changes that will directly impact the unincorporated Corcoran Fringe areas with higher fees, possible fines, and place the City in a position of "Non-Compliance" with the County adopted ordinance. According to County staff, only the Corcoran Fringe, Lemoore Fringe, and community of Grangeville are subject to the County's new enforcement ordinance, and residents and businesses will be subject to covering the estimated annual costs of \$300,000 and be subject to noncompliance fines. The City's franchise waste hauler is Tule Trash, and for two decades or more the City has extended efficient consolidated waste hauling service to the County Fringe. However, these accounts will no longer be authorized under the County's new ordinance.

The County's SB 1383 Ordinance provisions that will pose challenges to the existing efficient consolidation of City waste hauling services with Corcoran Fringe are as follows:

- 1. The Ordinance allows an "open market" approach to customer accounts, which authorizes each resident and business owner to choose a waste hauler of their choice or self-haul. The City does not have the authority to require residents or businesses to select Tule Trash as an extension of the City's franchise.
- 2. Section 13-36 defines Cities needing a County License that is yet to be defined for collection outside their jurisdiction and in compliance with this County Ordinance. The City does not have a County license to authorize collection of waste in the Corcoran Fringe, and the County's ordinance requirements are significantly more complex than the City's due to the County allowing an "open market" and not consolidated with one waste hauler.
- 3. Section 13-39 requires that all residents and businesses receiving services through a licensed hauler "shall" be billed directly by the licensed hauler. This provision direction restricts the City's ability to continue servicing Corcoran Fringe accounts through the City's utility billing services.

Based upon these County Ordinance changes, the City will need to revise the current City utility billing accommodations for solid waste hauling in the unincorporated Corcoran Fringe that have been in place for over two decades. Staff is recommending that a City notice be sent out to the approximate 170 accounts currently accommodated notifying them of the change. The attached map provides a visual of the County unincorporated areas in the Corcoran Fringe that will be impacted with the red dots representing current accounts that the City collects.

SUBJECT: Permanent Local Housing Allocation Program

Summary:

California Department of Housing and Community Development has notified our City of eligible Permanent Local Housing Allocation (PLHA) funding.

Recommendation:

Receive a draft copy of the City's PLHA Plan for comment, and direct staff to prepare a public hearing notice and resolution for the October 25, 2022 Council meeting to authorize submittal of the PLHA application.

Budget impact:

None with this action. If the City is successful in applying for PLHA funding, the five year funding for 2019-2023 is estimated to be \$683,453. Funding must be used for an eligible affordable housing activity.

Background:

In 2017, the State adopted SB 2 and established the Building Homes and Jobs Act which added a \$75 recording fee to all real estate documents to increase the supply of affordable homes in California. This recording fee is collected and then made available to jurisdictions through an application to the State's Permanent Local Housing Allocation Program. The first round of funding allocation made available covers 2019-2023. The State only allows jurisdictions to apply for the current year and past two years of allocation. On September 13, 2022, the City Manager was notified by the State that Corcoran's 2019 allocation of \$113,908 would be diverted to the State housing fund if the City does not apply by October 31, 2022. The 2020 allocation is \$178,438, and \$179,560 for 2021.

PLHA funding is required to be used for affordable housing related activities. Many of the eligible activities are either programs already supported by the City's CDBG funding or development and housing trust funds that the City is not in a position to support currently. The

most applicable activity based upon the City's current priorities is Eligible Activity 301(a)(6) for "Assisting persons who are experiencing or At-risk of homelessness, including, but not limited to, providing rapid re-housing, rental assistance, supportive/case management services that allow people to obtain and retain housing, operating and capital costs for navigation centers and emergency shelters, and the new construction, rehabilitation, and preservation of permanent and transitional housing."

§302(c)(4)(A) Describe the manner in which allocated funds will be used for eligible activities

The City of Corcoran will use allocated funds to assist persons who are experiencing or at risk of experiencing homelessness in Corcoran by establishing and maintaining the City's first ever local emergency shelter, and secondarily providing supplemental grant funding to support and maintain local transitional and supportive housing that is pre-qualified through Kings County Human Services Agency's supportive housing program and already linked with supportive servcies. Over the five year plan period, the first two years of funding will be prioritized for the creation of new housing units for the City's homless and at risk population. As new units are established, the third, fourth and fifth year funding will shift to support ongoing maintenance of the units, and support for subsistance living resource needs and/or social services and behavior health services case management assistance

§302(c)(4)(B) Provide a description of the way the Local government will prioritize investments that increase the supply of housing for households with incomes at or below 60 percent of Area Median Income

(AMI).

Homeless individuals and families are considered to be "Very-Low Income" at 30% or less of area AMI, and further classified as "Presumed Beneficiaries" under the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) guidelines which defines them as "Very-Low Incom." PLHA funding is only planned to address a significant shortage of emergency shelter, and transitional and supportive housing in the City of Corcoran that increases available housing for the lowest income and most vulnerable populations in the community.

§302(c)(4)(C) Provide a description of how the Plan is consistent with the programs set forth in the Local Government's Housing Element.

The City's 5th Cycle (2016-2024) Housing Element (a Joint County & 4 City Housing Element) was adopted and approved by HCD in 2016, and provided guiding policies to accommodate emergency shelters, transitional and supportive housing for local homeless populations. Table 2-32 estimated Corcoran to have 19 homeless individuals. This Element identified Kings County that includes the City of Corcoran as haveing a significant shortage of emergency shelters and transitional housing. The City has adopted the required zoning compliance measures to support emergency shelters and transitional/supportive housing, but has lacked the necessary funding to establish and support these types of housing resources locally. This plan directly implements measures to achieve the City's Housing Element Goal 4 to "Provide housing assistance to extremely-low, low, and moderate -income households and those special housing needs," and Policy 4.3 to "Support the provision of housing suitable for special needs groups, including homeless people." In addition, this plan furthers the City's implementation of Corcoran's Housing Element Program 2.11 for Emergency Shelters and Transitional/Supportive Housing by providing funding to make these types of housing units a reality in the community

Emergency Shelter. First and second year funding will be applied to an existing City owned property to prepare site development and construction of the City's emergency shelter estimated to begin in 2023 and completed in 2024.
